This is to officially notify you that US Customs & Border Protection seized the property described below at LA/LB ports on May 28, 2013:

The property was seized and is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Title 19, United States Code, Section 1526(e) as implemented by Title 19, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 133.21.

The merchandise which you attempted to import under entry number is subject to forfeiture because each of the articles bears a counterfeit copy of the following trademark which is registered with the United States Patent and Trademark Office and recorded with U.S. Customs and Border Protection: UL, LLC, trademark recordation number (TMK) 01-00176, and the importation of such items is prohibited.

Unless you obtain written consent from each trademark owner to import or export and provide it to this office within thirty (30) days of this notification, the merchandise will be forfeited and disposed of in accordance with Title 19 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 133.52. You may obtain contact information for the trademark holder(s) by going to the CBP.gov website <a href="http://iprs.cbp.gov/">http://iprs.cbp.gov/</a>, or clicking on the quicklink for "Intellectual Property Rights" and searching for the applicable trademark(s).

The facts available to CBP indicate that you might have an interest in the seized property. The purpose of this letter is to advise you of the options available to you concerning this seizure. An important document is enclosed with this letter. Please do not ignore it. This document is the "Election of Proceedings" form. You should choose one of the options outlined below, indicate your choice on the "Election of Proceedings" form, and return it and any other necessary documents to CBP within the allotted time frame. Even if you are abandoning the property, you should complete the "Election of Proceedings" form and return it to CBP.
